

COVID-19 in Africa: Supply chain disruptions and the role of the Africa **Continental Free Trade Agreement**

ABSTRACT

The pandemic has led to discourse on the supply chains of African countries' healthcare markets, emphasizing the need for an increase in local manufacturing of medical resources. Several African countries' health markets have been heavily reliant on imports, highlighting the need to strengthen continental value chains and local manufacturing capacity. COVID-19 has led to an increase in self-reliance through production partnerships and collaboration between health organizations, which are essential to establish the continent's new public health order. The case studies presented are the COVID-19 test developed in Senegal, hands free washing stations in Sierra Leone, and the creation of personal protective equipment in Ghana, Kenya, Malawi. This highlights progress made toward health market reform and calls attention to the implementation of the Africa Continental Free Trade Area to strengthen the supply, manufacturing, and trade of medical resources.
